Summary

A lawsuit has been filed this October regarding the death of Robert "Ethan" Saylor. Earlier this year, Saylor, who had Down syndrome, became agitated after watching Zero Dark Thirty, at a movie theater. Police officers on the scene forced him to lie on his stomach on the ground, where he immediately began having trouble breathing and died. Frederick County's grand jury declined to indict the officers.

Review Questions

How many people have already signed a petition to reopen Saylor's case? What does this amount of support suggest about how the general public feels about the grand jury's decision?

In the end, why weren't the officers charged with homicide?
